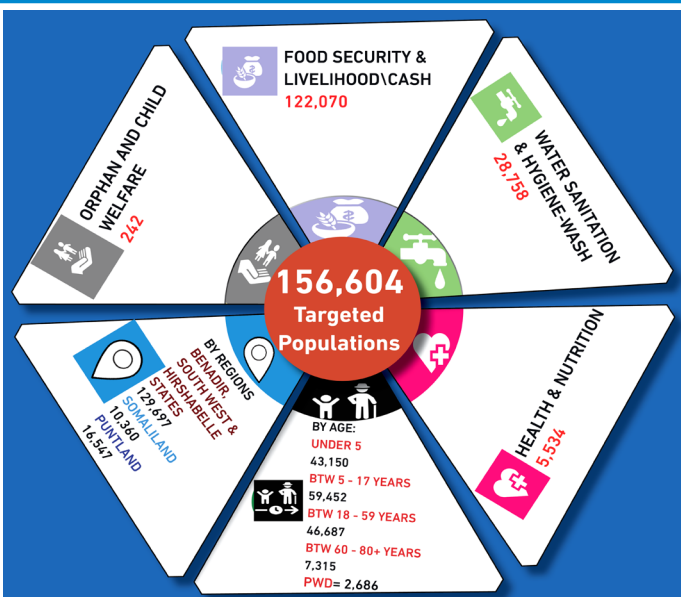


Islamic Relief supported a total of 156,604 targeted population through WASH, Food Security & Livelihood, Cash Transfers, Health Intervention, Orphan & Child Welfare programme

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- The 2022 March to June rainy season was extremely poor, with rainfall levels across much of the Horn of Africa region being among the lowest in the past 70 years. It was a historic fourth consecutive failed rainy season.
- In Somalia, staple food prices have more than doubled or tripled, surpassing levels recorded during the 2011 famine. Cholera, Measles, Typhoid, and Dysentery are on the rise with significant child mortality.
- About 568,000 children were admitted for Severe Acute Malnutrition treatment in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia from January to June. Around 6.5 million children are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition in the three countries.
- Estimates indicate that 18.6 to 21.1 million people face high levels of acute food insecurity due to the drought in the three countries. Parts of Somalia are facing a risk of famine through at least September.
- Food Security and Nutrition Working group (FSNWG) currently estimates that between 23 - 26 million people could face high levels of acute food insecurity by February 2023 due primarily to the drought in the region, if the October to December rains fail.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- Marketing training 305(M-824 F-1006) widowed mothers from in the four villages (Sh. Ahmed Salan, Sh. Ali Jowhar, Sh. Osman and Sh. Makahil) and Five IDPs under Borama city received marketing training; the training was designed to help women overcome the challenges they face in running their businesses.
- Provision of Third tranche of Unconditional Cash Transfers to 1,500 (645 male, 855 Female) drought-affected households in Ceegaag, Goljano, Qoyta and Murayada villages in Buhoodle and Burao district of Togdheer region.
- Distribution of value chain fruit processing machines and packaging units to (100 farmers) in Afgoye for promoting their agricultural production transport and marketing
- Unconditional Cash Transfer beneficiary of 100HHS final cycles under the DEC Project (M-279, F-321)
- Training on women association / Handcraft for IGA/ VSLA to 8 IDPs Women Groups for 80 HH (210 Male, 270 Female) In a Baidoa
- CFW Cash Transfer beneficiary 138 HH (393 Male, 435 Female) under the DEC project first round payment delivered in July.
- Training 500 Beneficiaries (387 Male, 113 Female) on Good Agricultural Practice (GAP) in Lafole, Garaash, Shiniile, Nimcaan, Biyo-Qurun, Bacaad village of Beledweyne District.

- Last cycle Unconditional Cash transferred to the 500 beneficiaries (1,510 M, 1,554 F) in Beledweyne.
- Provision of UCT for vulnerable communities in Daynille for 2,012 males & 2,084 Females.
- Eid Gifts in Baidoa for about 460 Children (300 Boys, 160 Girls).
- Qurbani 2022 Meat distribution in Baidoa for about 97,836 persons (M-28,918 F-68,918)
- Qurbani 2022 Meat distribution in Beledweyne for about 8,446HHs (28,851 Males, 27,184 Females)
- Distribution of Qurbani meat for the targeted communities in Benadir (Daynille, Grasbaley) for about 35,652 Males and 29,652 Females).

HEALTH

- Primary health care services; consultation - Provide consultations of non- communicable diseases such as pneumonia, malaria, diarrhea, skin conditions, injury care and urinary tract infections, sexually transmitted infections among others in women, men, boys and girls for 3,916 individuals (M-1,568 F-2,348) in Benadir – Daynile, Shibis and Balcad.
- Provided Maternal health services -Antenatal care services at the health facility for 739 Women in Daynile & Shibis and Balcad. Provided Maternal health services - Postnatal Care at the health facility for 160 Women in Daynile, Shibis and Balcad.
- Support Immunizations targeting vaccine preventable diseases provided to children under five (BCG, Polio, Penta, Measles, etc.) for 102 Boys and 198 Girls in Daynile, Shibis and Balcad.

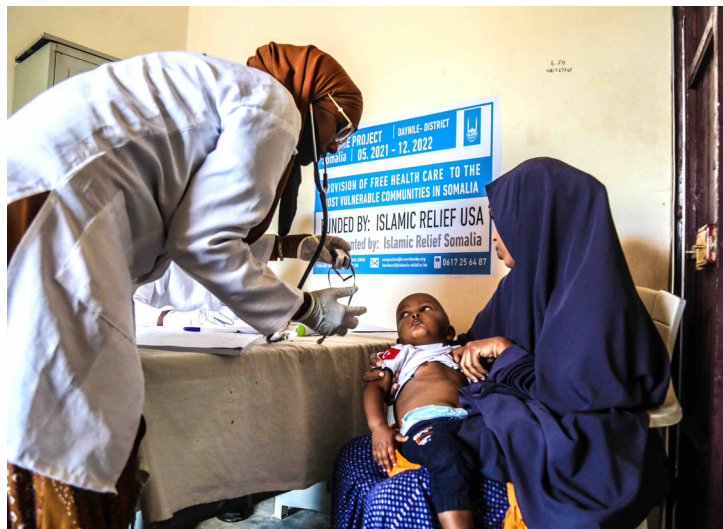

WASH

- IRS have completed 2 Boreholes which are completely functional with community are fetching water from newly constructed water kiosks in Togdheer region, Buhodle and Burao district reaching (400Male,300 Females)
- IR Completed Rehabilitation of 4 Boreholes/shallow wells in Bulahar and Lughaya District targeting a total of 2,722 persons (1400 Male,1322 Females)
- Provision of Emergency water trucking 1,500 HHs (427 Males ,1073 Females) in Bardhere
- Provision of NFI for 250HH (54 Male,196 Female) who were the most vulnerable persons in Bardhere IDP camps.
- IRS completed successfully Rehabilitation and solar installation of Mindhicir borehole in Sanag region where 5,000 individuals (M-1,750, F-3,250) will access to clean and adequate water sources.
- IRS completed a shallow well rehabilitation, solar system installation and pipeline extension for Dhanaha Camp/ village in Badhan district. This will enable access water to 1,000 individuals (M-350, F-650)
- 4,000 individuals (M-1,994, F-2,006) affected by droughts were provided water trucking while every person gets

ORPHANS AND CHILD WELFARE

- Conducted Awareness and advocacy on faith inspired training provide an awareness and advocacy related the orphan property, how to manage what they received on behalf of their children to 305 orphan right holders (M-824 F-1,006) in Borama.
- Enlisting for OSP increment for eligible orphan HHs who passed the criteria for increment for 40 Orphans (Boys -22 Girls -18) in Hargeisa.
- 590 (513 Boys ,77 Girls) Orphan families benefited the Qurbani meat of 2022 in Hargeisa and Borama.

GENDER INCLUSION & SAFEGUARDING

- Conducted child protection and GBV awareness on enhancing children's safety, dignity and rights and avoid exposing them to further harm, to support the capacity of the women and children to protect themselves, to familiarize self with the concepts, principles and importance of child protection and protection for the following IDP sites :(Adable Gunre (65 Women and 10 Men), Barwaqo (20 Women and 10 Men) Bulo Oomin (105 Women and 20 Men).

Islamic Relief Somalia's PH-CARE Project supports the most vulnerable families in Somalia through free health care

In response to the outbreak of COVID-19 in Somalia and poorness of the health care, vulnerability of the internally displaced people and the host communities, Islamic Relief started the implementing of PH-CARE Project (Provision of Primary Health Care in Somalia).

It is now supporting the vulnerable people in the country through free health care in three health centers of Daynile, Shibis of Mogadishu and Balcad of Middle Shabelle district.

It is a life-saving health assistance to the IDPs and host communities of three areas mentioned while it will provide health support of about 85,716 people of men, women and children of all ages.

Upon our visit to Daynile health center, we met with Nafisa Abdulkadir who was among the right holders that was getting medical checkups from Islamic Relief Somalia's medical doctors at Shibis clinic.

“I am a mother of four kids living in shibis and very happy the support of Islamic Relief. Now, I am almost in the second week of my delivery to this baby girl on my lap in this clinic” “I am really grateful to Islamic Relief and the donor for the support as I could not afford the private hospitals' costs”, says Nafisa Abdulkadir.

“I always come to this clinic and my children as well. 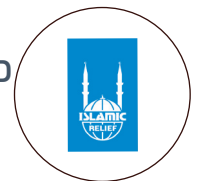
