

Banadir, Hirshabelle & South West States

- FLORA PROJECT (IRUSA)- Hygiene promotion sessions for 300 HHs in Afgooye conducted for floods affected populations. Five (5) sessions and were conducted in :1. Barwaqo IDP Camp (60 participants), 2. Eyle 1 (60 participants),3. Eyle 2 (60 participants),4. Wacdi Baxnaano IDP camp (60 participants), and 5. Nabad & Nolol IDP camp (60 participants)
- Performing proper hygiene practices include showering or bathing regularly, washing hands regularly and especially before handling food done through IEC materials including stickers, A3 papers and pamphlets
- REDCAP PROJECT (IRUSA)- Hygiene promotion sessions for 300 HHs in Baidoa IDPs of Mudug IDP (70 HHs), Nasiib wanag (50 HHs), Robo Fayla 2 (30 HHs), Bulo Goof (50 HHs), Gurmeysi (50 HHs), Labawarood (50 HHs) with 600 persons (1,206 female and 594 male) the sessions done using IEC materials.
- REDCAP PROJECT (IRUSA)- Distributed agricultural seeds to 500 HHs of these items: Maize/Sorghum (15 kg), Beans (10 kg)
- REDCAP PROJECT (IRUSA)- Distribution of water melon (250 gram), Tomato (500 gram), Hot pepper (100 gram), and Bell Pepper (100 gram) for 500 HHs 380 M 88 F 22 PWDs,10 PLW) in Bacaad(130 HHs), Baslawe(130 HHs), Qoqane(120 HHs), Ilkacado (80 HHs) and Towfiq Village (40 HHs).
- REDCAP PROJECT (IRUSA)- Provision of Grape Hoe (2 pcs), Axe (1pc), Spade (1pc), and bags of 50 kg (25 pcs) and ploughing farming land Each household was provided 4 hectares of ploughing service for their agricultural land for 300 HHs (Male 181 Female 91 PWD 12 PLW 16) in Five villages including Bacaad (80 HHs), Baslaawe (80HHs), Qooqane (80HHs), ilkacado (40 HHs) and Towfig (20 HHs).in Beledweyne.

Puntland

- WIN PROJECT (IR MALAYSIA)- Construction of Yombays borehole infrastructure: Water tank benefiting 2,600 persons with a capacity of 48 m3; 4 water kiosks with rooms, 2 animal troughs with a capacity of 2 m3; 1,837 m of pipeline extension from the water tank in three different points in the village, 1 generator and guardrooms and addition to solar system installation with 1,000V system voltage successfully completed. The borehole serves 5,000 (3,000 Male, 2,000 Female) vulnerable people in Yombays village and surrounding areas.
- **ERBIG PROJECT (IR UK)-** In response of flush floods impact in Qardho district of Puntland, **11** Latrines were in the Qardho IDP camp serving **330** individuals of **30** per latrines.
- CERIS PROJECT (DEC)- Unconditional Cash transfers provided and distributed to Garowe IDPs with a rate of \$80 for 150 HHs (122 Female and 28 male)
- **REDCAP (IRUSA)-** Cash transfers provided and distributed to Qardho for 140 HHs flood affected Households.
- **OSP PROJECT (IRW)-** Annual progress report collection for each and every orphan registered in Garowe has begun on 19th of January, 2021 for 145 (73 Boys, 72 Girls) orphans; so far 159 reports have been collected
- **OSP PROJECT (IRW)- 18** Orphan Children got sponsorships from donors in Europe and America in Garowe

Somaliland

- **DELP PROJECT (IRUSA)-** In January 2021, Conditional Cash transfer was released to 100 HHs affected by the desert locust. The target people dug trenches through cash for work for control of desert locust grass hoppers in Fuguho,Ceel-sheikh and Bulahar villages.
- **FPA PROJECT (IRUK)-** A total of **36** farmers (**27** men and **9** women) six days training on haymaking conducted by Amoud University in Baki, Ruqi and Old Baki villages of Awdal region -Somaliland by equipping the basic fodder conservation technology and good practices of fodder production. FPA PROJECT (IRUK) Water pan (earth pan) of **25,000** cubic meters of water
- was rehabilitated in Baki district.
- FPA PROJECT (IRUK)- 8 shallow wells were successfully rehabilitated. Activities such as excavation of shallow wells, casting and construction of reinforced concrete ring beams for 8 shallow wells, construction of cover slab and providing steel door (One in Old Baki, Three in Ruqi, One in Baki district, Two in Xeego village and one in Cadaad village)
- **OSP (IRW)-** Annual progress report collection for each and every orphan registered in Hargeisa has begun in January 2021 for **530** (**320** Boys ,**210** Girls) orphan children in Ahmed Dhagah & Kobdur districts of Hargeisa town.
- **OSP (IRW)- 8** Orphan (4 boys, 4 Girls below 12 years) Children got sponsorships from donors in Europe and America and the rest are available on the system in Hargeisa.
- **OSP (IRW)- 18** bank accounts for newly sponsored orphans was issued and distributed to orphan families while they received their pass books from IRS Hargeisa office.

Islamic Relief Somalia has been working for some time to support the vulnerable communities in Garowe IDP camps of Puntland.

Islamic Relief supported these IDPs through; cash money, hygiene awareness campaigns of cash for work.

Faduma is a 42-year-old single mother of seven who lives in a camp in Garowe. Their families' livelihoods depended on pastoralism, while most of their animals were destroyed by the repeated droughts in Somalia.

Faduma, who is overjoyed, shed in tears and said," It was very difficult for us to get enough food and drink, and I could not even afford to pay the rent of a small house to a family of campers living here " "We are very grateful to Islamic Relief for its generous support."

"We received money and hygiene awareness sessions from Islamic Relief, which has been instrumental in changing the lives of people in these camps. It is a service that deserves a thousand times thank", says, Faduma.

"I really acknowledge Islamic Relief, they have helped us a lot my Allah reward the entire team" " now, we are from naught to a family of appiration", Says, Faduma Aden.

"I call on the organization and all donors to support the people living in and around the IDP camps in Garowe as there are much needs of humanitarian assistance", concludes Faduma.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia election uncertainty and with no clear timeline set for election is putting the country into a limbo and is further aggravating the peace and stability. • Desert locust is yet again experienced in the Somaliland and Puntland and is affecting forage, and crop production. This will impact

negatively on livelihood recovery and animal productions.


The country is facing multiple shocks and stress which is impacting

greatly recovery of the country from the humanitarian crisis. The

 Covid-19 third wave is in full spike causing more deaths with many patients exhibiting breathing problems. Main hospitals and isolation centres are lacking Oxygen and Oxygen productions plants.

Islamic Relief is in the front line and in those regions affected by natural and man-made hazards implementing food security and livelihood Nutrition programming; water infrastructure development, COVID-19 risk reduction projects and protection and safeguarding of the population of impact.

In Summary



Banadir, Hirshabelle & South West States

- A total of 250 households (1,475 persons) are directly benefiting through casual work gaining 100\$ per family. They are rehabilitating a 20KM channel rehabilitation for irrigation in five villages: Bacad, Qoqane, Baslawe, Dhariyow and Lafoole.
- 5 shallow wells were rehabilitated for IDPs in Beledweyne. Each IDP household will receives 45 liters of water per day, which is the minimum amount of water for survival. A total of 3,552 households (2,350 Females ,1,202 males) of internal displaced persons are accessing safe water from the rehabilitated shallow well in their IDP Camps.
- 4,000 households (25,480 persons) (Women: 11,466, Men: 7,644, Boys: 2,911, Girls: 3,459) in Towfiq IDP camp in Jowhar town of Middle Shabelle are being provided clean and safe water through water trucking for period of 60 days from 1st February to 31st March 2021.
- Provision of monthly teachers' incentives of \$70 per month for 20 teachers (17 males, 3 females) in Balcad.
- Distribution of Sanitary pads for 400 adolescent school girls in Balcad for the purpose of menstrual hygiene Management.
- OPD consultations and treatment at the three health centers of Islamic Relief for 3,111 people. Shibis: Patients 841 (Males: 182 Females: 372 Boys: 125 Girls: 162), Daynile: Patients 993 (Males:157 Females: 380 Boys: 200 Girls: 256), Balcad: Patients 1,277 (Males: 232 Females: 485 Boys: 249 Girls: 311)
- Reproductive health services including of ANC, PNC and deliveries for 892 pregnant women, lactating women and deliveries. Shibis: 391 patients, Daynile: 248 patients & Balcad: 253 patients.
- Provided immunization vaccines for 186 children & 85 pregnant women. (Shibis: 88 girls and 98 boys and 85 pregnant women).
- PPE kits distribution including Facemask 1 piece, Laundry Soap 1 box, Gloves (pair) 2 pieces, hand sanitizer 1 piece, face mask, bottle 250 ML 1 piece, Dettol soap 4 pieces, Laundry Soap 1 box for **Covid-19** prevention for 700 househodls (3,200 Females, 1,000 Males) were distributed in Afgooye District.
- Hygiene promotion of Covid-19 prevention measures, environmental cleaning and open eradication of open defecation sessions were given to 570 households in Baidoa IDP Camps such as; Mudug IDP, Nasiib Wanag, Robow Fayla 2, Buulo.

Puntland

- More than 10,000 persons of Yombays residents and rural communities have secured enough to access clean water for drinking and domestic purposes using water kiosks near to their rooms.
- IRS Conducted community mobilization in Kulule and Ceeldhidir villages for development of fishing activities. IRS planned to set up cooperatives of fisheries in Kulule village. 32 orphan children (20 boys ,12 Girls) were registered and uploaded to Alyateem site in Garowe, Sin Ujiif and Dangorayo.

Somaliland

- 3,000 households living in 9 villages under Awdal and Gabilay regions which are (Old Baki, Rugi, Baki, Magalo-cad, Sharafwayne, Dhalaada, Geesta dheer, Kidiga-dhanan, and Jidhi) were mobilized and sensitized and selected for project support.
- A total of 1,000 farmer families (600 Males and 400 females) received agricultural input support (seeds and farm tools) and engaged in Cash for work activities of desilting of an earth dam. 1,000 right holders (600 male and 400 females) were selected, registered and verified.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

The persistent danger posed by the COVID-19 pandemic in Somalia is rapidly increasing day after day. The virus is spreading at an alarming rate; subsequently the number of people failing ill from the virus and the number of people confirmed Have increased to more han 10,000.

Many parts of Somalia are currently experiencing drought conditions. triggered by below average 2020 Deyr (October-December) season rainfall which was characterized by depressed rains with poor spatial and temporal distributions and harsh conditions during the typically dry Jilal (January-March) season

AstraZeneca vaccine administered so far in Somaliland (20.247 s), Benadir Region (11,903 persons) and Puntland (11320 persons

Locust Upsurge is also reported in some parts of Somaliland and Badhan in Puntland

Islamic Relief Somalia is planning to provide and procure Medical ment For 3 hospitals (2 PSA-Oxygen Factories/plants 120 Cylinders) with support from IR Canada, The Humanitarian team are planning to make a documentary of COVID19 centers by assessing potential need of Oxygen plant to Garowe, Hargeisa & Martini hospital

In Summary



Banadir, Hirshabelle & South West States

OPD consultations and treatment at the three health centers managed by Islamic Relief for 2,564 Male, female, boys and girls. (Shibis Male: 107, Female: 190, Boys: 88, Girls: 97, Daynile Male: 163 , Female: 342 Boys: 210 Girls: 210, Balcad Male: 198 , Female: 409 Boys: 244 Girls: 306)

Reproductive health services including of ANC, PNC and deliveries for 909 Pregnant women, lactating women were delivered. (Shibis: 391 Daynile: 277 and Balcad: 241)

A total of **211** children under **5** and pregnant were provided with immunization vaccines (Shibis: Female: 9 Male: 12, Balcad Male: 79 Female: 111)

Hygiene promotion sessions for 570 persons (240 Male, 330 Female) were provided to IDPs in Baidoa. The session were on good hygiene behaviors such as PHAST- Participatory Hygiene and Sanitation Transformation & COVID19 awareness messages such Personal hygiene through hand washing with soap always, ensuring nails are short and bathing.

Construction of hybrid shelter houses for 480 families (225 Male, 255 Females) in Baidoa IDP Camps.

Unconditional Cash Transfer to 300 HHs (1,051 Female, 749 Male) of the most vulnerable & floods affected communities in Afgove were distributed. Each Person received 70\$ monthly.

PPE kits distribution for **Covid-19** prevention for **2.400** individuals (1,467 female,933 Male) in Afgoye.

Hygiene promotion sessions for 200 individuals (134 Female, 66 Male) were conducted in Afgove. The sessions include Critical Handwashing, Menstrual hygiene management (MHM), household water treatment and environmental clean ups.

Construction of library for evergreen school in Balcad expected to support 700 students (300 girls ,400 boys)

Payment of Monthly incentive for 21 teachers (17 males, 4 female) in evergreen school in Balcad.

Beneficiary registration for1,500 (629 male & 871 female) in Jowhar-Middle Shebelle to receive NFI and hygiene kits.

Water trucking for 4,000 beneficiaries (2,200 female & 1,800 male) in Kaambarow/Towfig IDP camp in Jowhar provided life saving water to the vulnerable group.

Training of hygiene promotion for 29 community volunteers (15 females and 14 male) in Jowhar. Topics trained on include household water treatment, safe excreta disposal, critical handwashing, solid waste management and uptake of COVID-19 prevention measures for the target areas.

Training on Protection /Gender mainstreaming and safeguarding principles has been conducted in Benadir for 40 Beneficiaries (17 Male. 23 Female)

Puntland

- Islamic Relief in collaboration Ministry of commerce and industry of Puntland conducted training for village saving and loans association (VSLA) for 25 beneficiaries (22 Female, 3 Male) the training aimed to provide fundamental village saving and village association skills to unemployed youth and women searching for alternative livelihoods options in the Qardho district.
- Scope registration for 8,588 Baxnaano beneficiaries successfully completed, all of the registered beneficiaries are female.
- 1,421 Baxnaano beneficiaries received a cash transfer, all of the beneficiaries are women.
- In collaboration of the Puntland Ministry of agriculture and irrigation, a total of 20 farmers (18 Male, 2 female) from Dhuur, Barookhle and Kubo villages under the Bari region recieved training on Good Agricultural Practice (GAP)
- In partnership with Puntland Water Development Agency (PWDA), water management committees for Kubo, Kulule, Ceeldhidir and Dhuur villages in Bari region were established and trained. 7 members were nominated from every location.
- With support of the Puntland water Development Agency (PWDA), a total of 28 water management committees (23 Male ,5 females were trained on water facilities operation and maintenance, water management, social cohesion, water quality testing and hygiene/ sanitation improvement.
- 04 2020 Sponsorship Fund were released and notified to 745 Orphan Children (408 Boys & 337 Girls) in Nugal Region of Puntland for supporting their welfare and educational costs.
- 113 New Orphan children (43 Boys & 70 Girls) has been registered under Sponsorship Scheme from Burtinle, Jalam, Sin uJiif and Dangorayo Districts under Nugaal Region

Somaliland

- Drought Need Assessment were carried out in Somaliland between 28-February -03 March, 2021, in two areas; covering two districts (Dacarbudhuq and Abdal) and 6 surrounding villages.
- The objective of the assessment was to assess the current food security and livelihood situation of the communities, to assess WASH gaps included water infrastructures, hygiene and sanitation status and to engage donor communities on the assessment findings for funding purpose.
- Q4 2020 Sponsorship Fund have been released and notified to 3,243 Orphan Children (1,673 Boys & 1,570 Girls) in Maroodijeeh & Sahil Regions of Somaliland to support their welfare and educational costs.
- General living status and educational progress for 461 Orphan Children (242 Boys & 219 Girls) were monitored and reported to their sponsors via Alyateem Site.

OUR HEROINE for March 2021 Amina Isack Abdi, 55. From Daynile - Mogadishu



"This is really a gift which was sent by God to poor families like my family"

Amina Isack Abdi, 55, is a mother of six children. Despite her age, she is the sole breadwinner for her family. She lives in Daynile District of Mogadishu and runs a small trade shop to support her family where she sells onions, tomatoes, cabbages and salads.

Her husband Abukar, who is 70-years-old, is retired. He does not get any support from the government or any relative but relies on his wife Amina, and some of his children.

Amina and some of her villagers are often affected by diseases like Eczema, skin infections, Malaria and Influenza. Islamic Relief Somalia has come in to support them by providing free health care services at their next-door health center.

"Islamic Relief saved our lives through provision of basic health care services such as medical checkups, free treatment and sanitation sessions," says Amina Isack.

"We are so excited about getting this support from Islamic Relief. We have been getting free medical care at this clinic for many years", Amina explains. "We always tell our neighborhood people to go and seek free medical checkups at the Islamic Relief medical center." "This is really a gift which is sent by God to the poor families like my family", says Amina Isack

"All of us; my children, my husband and I are always here for free health care as we cannot afford to pay the hospital care costs." Amina concludes by saying, "We need such this support to continue and we appeal for the continuity of such this very supportive aid."

Islamic Relief Somalia planned to support over **90,000**, beneficiaries, and increase the resilience of low-income families through the Health, Education and Agricultural Livelihood Support in Balcad, Benadir & Beledweyne (**HEAL II**) project that is supported by Islamic Relief Canada.

Islamic Relief has been supporting health services to the most vulnerable populations in Benadir and Balcad since **2007**.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia Ithough the Gu rains started in some parts of the country, forecasts idicate below-average rainfall. At least 3.4 million people are rojected to be affected by drought conditions in 2021-OCHA.


As of 27th April 2021, a total of 1,286 suspected cases of COVID-19 were tested, of which 103 were to be laboratory-confirmed. The majority of 80 of those reported cases were from the Somaliland. Out of the 103 positive cases, 65 were male and 38 were female. The overall total so far stands at 13,915, with 5,847 recoveries and 713 deaths.

There was a reported increase of 2.3m in River Level especially nJowhar and Balcad as result of GU rain.

Political tension escalated between 22st - 26th April as a result ofconfrontation between FGS and the oppositions. Heavy gun fire were heard all over the districts of Karaan. Hodan, and Howl wadaag. This clash is attributed to disagreement in electoral model.

Desert Locust remain a key threat to food security. This is now compounded by the Covid-19 and its associated impact to livelihood of millions of Somalis.

Construction of 80 hybrid shelter houses for 480 families (225 Male, 255 Females) in Baidoa IDP Camps were completed and handed over.

3,552 persons (**1,328** Female,**1,875** Male, **114** PLW and Lactating **235**) from Gurmad and Webishabelle IDPs were provided with clean and safe water through rehabilitation of shallow well in Beledweyne.

200 emergency latrines for (**20** for PWDs and **180** latrines for flood affected people) were constructed thereby reaching **6,000** persons in Jowhar.

A total of 33 members from Community Hope Action were trained on safeguarding and protection Those trained are (19 Female ,14 Male) mainly from IDPs in Baidoa.

Puntland

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

An estimated 11,622 persons in 18 settlements along Mogadishu-Afgoye corridors were forced to flee, as land developers pushes them from their properties. More displacements are anticipated as more property development take center stage both in and around Mogadishu.

 Due to below average GU rainfall, there is a warning of rapid deterioration of vegetation conditions in many parts of the country. With no rains expected until October 2021, moderate to severe drought conditions in Somalia cannot be ruled out during the mostly dry Hagaa (July to September) season.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia Worsening drought conditions across Sool, Sanaag and Togdheer region of Somaliland, Bay, Middle Shabelle and Hiran in southern parts and Nugaal & Mudug region in Puntland contributing to elevated humanitarian needs, while localized flooding has adversely affected 400,000 people in Jowhar, Beledweyne since April.

 More than 2.8 million people across Somalia will likely face crisis—IPC 3—or worse levels of acute food insecurity through September with most affected likely affected area being Xudur, Baidoa, Hiran, Bari region of Puntland and Togdheer of Somaliland.

- Puntland WASH team conducted community mobilization and technical selection of **12** irrigation shallow in Dhuur, Barookhe and Adayo villages as well as selection of **12** farms to install drip irrigation system. Total beneficiaries reached were **20,040**, of whom **7,014** are male and **13,026** are female.

Islamic Relief Somalia's Health Education and Agricultural Livelihood Support in Balcad, Benadir and Beledweyne-Somalia (HEAL II) project is expected to support over **90,000** beneficiaries.

Farhiya Abdi Ibrahim, who is **26** years old is one of the beneficiaries of HEAL II project. The mother of three has been struggling to feed for her children for a number of years.

Her husband, Ahmed Aden, who is **40** years old, has no permanent job. He usually goes to Bakaro market, the biggest Somali Market, to carry food items and other commodities using his small wheelbarrow for people shopping there.

The family now lives in Daynile IDP camp where they built a small makeshift house and rely on support from humanitarian agencies including Islamic Relief.

During our visit to Daynile Health Clinic, Farhiya was at the emergency care section of the facility ran by Islamic Relief getting treatment and intensive care for her young daughter, Asha. The mother had accidentally spilled hot tea on the girl. Both the young daughter and mother were crying as they received treatment.

After three weeks of successive care and cure, the young girl has recovered from the burns and is now doing well.

"I was really shocked when the hot tea spilled on my daughter, Asha. I cried and was worried about the hospital costs. But through Allah's compassion, some of my neighborhoods advised me to go to Islamic Relief's health center", she explains. "When I came to the clinic, the team provided immediate medical care to my baby girl and I became happy", says Farhiya Abdi.

"Now, my daughter, Asha, has healed from the wounds of the hot tea Alhamdulliahi and I am really grateful to Islamic Relief and the health workers for their tireless support", she happily explains. "This is really unforgettable assistance. We live in the Daynile IDP camp of and I cannot afford the hospital costs but thanks to IRS and the donor for the aid", says Farhiya.

OUR HERO for SEPTEMBER 2021 Mustapha Abdi, 55, from Yombays, Puntland, Somalia

Islamic Relief Somalia's Water Wells in Nugal ,WIN Project, supports over 4,800 villagers in Puntland.

Mustapha Abdi, who is 55 years old father of 4 children is among the beneficiaries of this project. Mustapha is a camel herder man while the day -to-day daily food of his family depends on the camels' milk and meat.

Mustapha's family live in a village near Yombays, it is a large and more populated village in the South East of Garowe town about 90kms). The villagers did not have enough water and depended on rain water harvesting while their living circumstances were so convoluted because of the water scarcities in the zone.

Islamic Relief Somalia, getting fund from IR Malaysia, drilled a borehole which can accommodate thousands of inhabitants and animals to receive enough water.

People used to travel long trips to collect water by means of water lorry vehicles with high prices. Occasionally, evacuated from the village to where water is accessible.

During our visit to the borehole location in Yombays village of Islamic Relief Malaysia ,Mustapha was among a number of camel herders at the water troughs. He was so pleased so see us while he much-admired the assistance of Islamic Relief to the villagers.

"Without this borehole, here was an abandon place and people usually displaced during dry seasons to look for pasture and water. Now, everything turned into its opposite direction. Life is good, people are getting water next door, animals are enjoying the massive water of the borehole", says Mustapha.

"We are so grateful to IRS and the donor; we will not forget your support. The desert turned into well-off water place and societies used to die here because of water", he explains.

 Prolonged drought conditions have impacted many parts of Somalia since June with Jubbaland State being the worst affected. More than 125,000 people have been affected by water shortages and require urgent water assistance in Jubbaland; the situation may worsen if no rain falls in coming weeks.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia Thousands have been displaced in Somaliland and Galmudug, raising concerns about the plight of those affected. Authorities, local communities and partners are assisting those affected.

 Durable solutions interventions have the potential to be replicated and upscaled across Somalia, providing medium-term low-cost solutions to displacement and avoiding increased vulnerability and humanitarian costs that usually follow multiple evictions and protracted displacement.

In Hirshabelle, through a local flood committee, river embankments and dykes are being constructed alongside relaining walls to protect farmland from recurrent flooding. So far, 65 out of 300 breakages have been repaired.

SOMALILAND

- A total of 1,800 people (1,008 females and 792 males) received one-month of unconditional cash transfers to support their basic needs i.e., nutritional food and potable water; each family received 60 USD, which is the minimum expenditure basket recommended by the Cash Working Group.

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia Somalia is experiencing a worsening drought following three consecutive failed rainy seasons, and is at risk of a fourth consecutive underperforming rainy season in 2022. Many of the regions are already in IPC 4 which is an Emergency and may slip to IPC 5 familine. IR has faunched appeal of 4.7million USD for immediate lifesaving drought responses.

 As of 23rd November, about 2.6 million people – close to 22 per cent of the population in 66 out of 74 districts across the country are effected by drought and nearty 113.000 people are displaced by drought across the country.

The lack of access to safe and potable water coupled with poor hygiene and similation facilities have heightened the overall risk of water-borne diseases, with an increase in suspected cases of Acute Watery Diarrhea/ Cholera and measles.

The Government and humanitarian partners in Somalia are scalingup responses and reprogramming activities in order to address critical emerging needs but continue to be constrained by funding and access concerns in some of the affected areas.

The oxygen plant was donated by IR Canada and produces 1,200 cylinders per day. The oxygen plant will serve estimated people of more than 45,000 in Qardho district and surrounding area.

IRS released the first installment for the 21 VSLA groups (126 individuals) in Qardho district as startup capital for the constructed market shade. Every VSLA member received \$ 2,000.

SOMALILAND

Islamic Relief, in collaboration with the Ministry of Livestock and Fishery Development, has provided seven-days refresher training to 30 community animal health workers (1female and 29 male CAHWs) from pastoral and agropastoral communities in Magalo-cad, Old Baki, Baki, and Ruqi villages in Baki and Boram districts of Somaliland.

- A total of 700 vulnerable households (433 female and 267 male) were selected, registered and verified from eight target villages, including Bulahar, Ceel-Lahelay, Cabdi geedi, Fuguxo, Boodaale, Salay biyo kulul, Daboraqas, and Hadeyta for provision of USD 60 unconditional cash transfer for period of 3 months while 300HH ((168 females and 132 males) were registered for CFW in the same district targeting drought impact.
- Islamic Relief constructed one complete mini-water system in Kalmac village in the Sanaag region of Somaliland. this mini-water supply will provide enough water to 1,800 individuals (1,008 female and 792 male) and their livestock.

Islamic Relief Somalia's Response to Drought and Conflict Affected Population of Nugal and Bay Regions of Somalia (REDCAP) project improved the living conditions many families.

Habiba Hussein, who is 40 years old is among the beneficiaries of this project. The mother of six kids has been struggling with feeding of her kids for a number of years.

She is a single mother who lives in EL HEJJ IDP Camp in Baidoa. She was agro-pastrolist and their life was depending on farming and livestock but most of her animals left with the droughts.

Considering the influences of the famines in Bay region and enormous number of displaced peoples in Baidoa camps, Islamic Relief Somalia with funding from Islamic Relief USA started VSLAs training in the camps.

The team launched business literacy training for beneficiaries to enable them to run their own business in a good manner after investing and constructing of 10 convenience shops with solar lights to operate businesses at night.

After training of the most vulnerable households of about 100 families, IR Somalia started financing of \$5,000 dollars to each group women business of about10 groups.

Habiba Hussein was among the beneficiaries to benefit this project of REDCAP under Village Saving and Loans Associations-VSLAs groups.

"Now, as a chairwoman and leader of the VSLAs group, I can inspire other women to have more confident in this business and the take the advantage and the opportunities that the VSLA offers", she happily explains. "This is really unforgettable assistance. We live in this IDP camp and the life is difficult but thanks to IRS and the donor for the aid", says Habiba.



Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- Currently, more than 90 percent of the country is experiencing drought conditions at different severity magnitudes with the Southern and Central parts being worst affected.
- Drought conditions are expected to worsen during the first quarter of 2022 with possibility of extending to the second quarter due to extended impacts.
- As of 28th of December, there are 23,214 confirmed cases in Somalia with 1,314 confirmed death cases.
- The Government and humanitarian partners in Somalia are scaling-up responses and reprogramming activities in order to address critical emerging needs but continue to be constrained by funding and access concerns in some of the affected areas.
- Islamic Relief have secured funding from IRUSA. IR Canada and RRM through IR Sweden.

PUNTLAND

- The IRS team conducted rapid assessment in Bari, Nugal and Mudug regions to determine the current drought-affects to the community in these sites. In this assessment the team found that most of the berkeds (underground storages) dried up, dozens of boreholes non functions and the community suffering lack of drinking water, animal heads were lost due to the water scarcity and lack of pasture. Emergency project proposal was submitted and approved.
- To response, the current drought in the country, IRS team with the collaboration of the line ministry identified 2 strategic boreholes that need rehabilitation in Burtinle and Xaarxarka towns. These boreholes will serve total beneficiaries of 14,230 (8,429 are female while 5,900 are male). The rehabilitation activities will start soon.
- Islamic Relief Somalia with the collaboration of Puntland Water Development Agency conducted a Hydrogeological and Geophysical survey in Badhan district to determine suitable sites for boreholes drilling. The team identified and mapped 3 potential zones for borehole drilling.

- IRS team conducted drip irrigation and Greenhouse training, Six days of capacity building was carried out in the field, with a total of 15 beneficiaries (7 female and 8 male) in Kubo village.
- IRS with the collaboration of the Ministry of fishery and marine resources conducted 2 days of training in management, basic accounting, and marketing for Kulule and Ceeldhidir fishing cooperatives. Total beneficiaries are 6, all of them are male.
- IRS successfully completed the construction of cooperative blocks in Gumbah and Handa villages under Bari region. The cooperative blocks consist of an office, generator room, cover shed, fish cleaning table and toilet. These facilities will serve 10,800 individuals, 3,458 are male while 7,343 are female.
- The IRS officially handover the VSLA market to the VSLA beneficiaries through the local municipality. The market will service 21 female-only VSLA groups.
- IRS team distributed Sim Cards to 418HHs Baxnaano beneficiaries, these Sim Cards will facilitate cash transfer through the mobile. The five sites are Badhan, hadaftimo dhahar and Buran villages in the Sanag region.

SOMALILAND

- Islamic Relief distributed the second tranche of unconditional cash transfers to 400 households (215 females and 185 males) affected by the current drought. Each family received a monthly cash assistance payment of \$60 USD for a period of three months in Sallahley, Baliciise, Dhimbiriyaale and Ina-guuxa. A total of 700 vulnerable households (433 females and 267 males) were selected from eight target villages, including Bulahar, Ceel-Lahelay, Cabdi Geedi, Fuguxo, Boodaale, Salay biyo kulul, Daboragas, and Hadeyta, transferred the first round of unconditional cash transfers. in which each household received \$60 USD to meet their basic needs by purchasing food or other basic items of their choice.
- A total of 27 participants (24 men and 3 women) from different stakeholders attended the Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation training which was held in the Mansoor Hotel in Hargeisa from December 15–19, 2021. The participants were selected from line ministries and Islamic Relief Programme staff. The training focused on how to engage DRR and CCA with various stakeholders and how to strengthen their competence in DRR.

- The Doonyaha Mini-water system is nearly complete, with the contractor completing one elevated water tank, two kiosks, and laying pipe system, with only shallow well construction remaining. Following the completion of this mini-water system, it is expected to supply and provide enough water for 2,000 people (1,100 females and 900 males) as well as approximately 20,000 livestock.
- Islamic Relief team held 16 days of activism campaign in the Borama district of Somaliland's Awdal region. The global theme for this year was **"Orange The World"** while members of the community wore orange shirts, scarves, and caps with 16 Days of Activism Against GBV messages inscribed on them. The activism campaign included participation from women's groups, youth, community elders and government line ministers.
- 40 female beneficiaries received cash grant as a means of business promotion. Each beneficiary got 400 USD and in total 16,000 USD was disbursed via mobile transfer system (Zaad). Handing over veterinary medicines to Awdal Regional Office of Ministry of Livestock & Fishery Development.

- 703 annual progress reports were collected from sponsored orphan children out of which 388 are girls and 315 are boys.
- 207 sponsored orphans have been uploaded their yearly Annual Progress Reports to Al-Yateem site where 110 were girls and 97 were boys.
- 4,509 sponsored orphan children received their Q3. 2021 entitlement, out of which 2,124 were girls and 2,385 were boys
- Handing over of furniture, lab equipment and laboratory reagents to Malawle and Xeedho MCHs.
- Immunization services was given to both outreach and onsite fixed, to 309 individuals of which 257 were children (134 boys and 123 girls) and 52 women.
- 26 Community elders from the Eight districts of Hargeisa attended 2 days training on Protection, Sexual, Exploitation, Abuse & Harassment. (PSEAH) which was facilitated by Gender & Inclusion Coordinator of IRS, 16 Of those attendees were female while rest 11 were male participant.


