Islamic Relief Somalia launches PFP Project

PFP is a 20-month project that supports rights holders in Somaliland and Puntland.

Islamic Relief Somalia, with funding from Islamic Relief UK, has launched the Promoting Food Production for Small-Scale Farmers through Establishing Strategic Water Systems (PFP) project. This 24-month initiative focuses on enhancing agricultural production, improving livestock support, and increasing financial inclusion across Garowe in the Nugal region of Puntland and the Dacar Budhug and Darasalam districts of Somaliland. The project aims to reach 9,530 families, equivalent to 57,016 individuals, with a strong emphasis on sustainable development and community empowerment.

Through the PFP project, Islamic Relief Somalia is committed to enhancing food security, promoting sustainable agricultural practices, and empowering communities in some of the most vulnerable regions of Somalia.

For the past four years, Hamda Khadar Ibrahim, an HR officer based in Hargeisa, has seen personally the transforming influence of labor rights on employees and their unwavering dedication to helping others.

"World Labor Day is more than just a day off; it's a celebration of our efforts and the importance of our job," Hamda explains, reflecting on the significance of this important day. "It's an opportunity for us to recognize the hard work and dedication of all personnel who want to make a difference in Somalia."

Islamic Relief Somalia, a humanitarian organization committed to reducing suffering and assisting those in need, puts foremost on the well-being and rights of its staff members. The organization's policy on national holidays, such as World Labor Day, demonstrates this devotion.

The policy clarifies that "an employee must be entitled to all gazetted public holidays that coincide with normal working days with full pay in terms of labor proclamation in compliance with Somali labor laws." Employees of Islamic Relief are eligible for one day of work on May 1st."

For Hamda, this policy reflects a dedication to protecting the rights of its employees.

"This day off is more than just a legal responsibility; it's a show of respect and appreciation for the hard work that our staff members put in every day," she says. "It corresponds with Islamic Relief's fundamental values of compassion, dignity, and social justice."

The celebration of World Labor Day at Islamic Relief Somalia is more than just a day of relaxation; it's a celebration of the spirit of unity and the tireless efforts of people who work ceaselessly to help their communities. This spirit is reflected in Hamda's personal journey with the organization. With a strong desire to assist those in need, she is greatly motivated by the alignment of her personal principles with the objective of the organization.

"Working with Islamic Relief has been an enjoyable endeavor since it is more than simply a job; it is about making a significant difference," Hamda says. "Seeing the difference we make in people's lives every day is really fulfilling and motivates me to continue moving ahead."

Case study - Mustafa Hussein, Magalo-ad, Somaliland



Mustafa Hussein, a passionate father and farmer, resides in the heart of the Awdal region, specifically the village of Magalo-ad, Somaliland.

Mustafa, 53, supports his wife and 12 children with his farming activities. His life has been a constant struggle against adversity, yet his perseverance and determination come through.

"Islamic Relief not only transformed my life, but also planted a seed of hope," Mustafa says with a smile that shows his renewed sense of hope. His journey to self-sufficiency began a year ago, through to Islamic Relief's Strengthening Community Resilience and Economic Empowerment Programme (SHEEP), which supports farmers and communities in need in Somaliland and Puntland.

Previously, Mustafa's days were filled with concern as he struggled to provide even one meal every day for his children. Severe droughts frequently devastated his herd, forcing him to switch to farming.

However, pests and environmental problems repeatedly hindered his efforts. He anticipated farming his land without these worries and learning new techniques to better his farm and livestock. When Islamic Relief presented Mustafa to the SHEEP Project, he believed it was a dream. Islamic Relief set up a greenhouse on his land, which he shares with two other households.

"It transformed me from a struggling farmer to someone who actively invests in his land," Mustafa says. "We saved over \$1,000 by using the greenhouse they provided, and we invested in more livestock. "This is really important to my family."
