Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

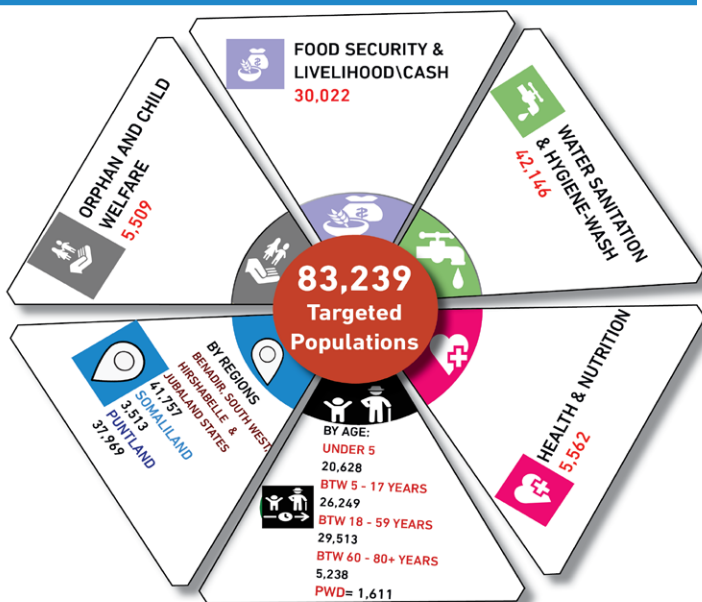
- The humanitarian situation in Somalia remains critical in 2024, with 6.9 million people in need of assistance, a 16% reduction from 8.25 million in 2023.
- The 2024 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan (HNRP) will require US\$1.6 billion to meet the needs of 5.2 million people, a reduction of almost 40 percent compared to 2023.
- The HNRP will also prioritize integrated and risk-informed programming, as well as advocacy for development and international financing support.
- Humanitarian organizations are scaling up cholera response activities as cases are reported in districts that were recently affected by heavy rains and floods, but need more supplies and funding.
- Food prices have stabilized, which is attributed to the restoration of supply chains facilitated by improved roads, enabling transportation of goods that were hampered by floods.
- Islamic Relief Somalia is one of leading humanitarian organizations in battling disasters and delivering life-saving aid in Somalia. It implements programmes go beyond meeting basic needs at the onset of an emergency to helping affected communities recover and rebuild their lives.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- Islamic Relief Somalia released microfinance grants to seven Village Savings and Loans Associations (VSLAs) groups comprising of 150 households in Baki, Ruqi, Magaalo'ad, and Borama in Awdal region of Somaliland. Each household received \$400 as a soft loan.
- IR Somalia conducted Community-Based Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change training. 18 participants from target villages (Borama, Baki, Magaalo-cad, Old-Baki and Ruqi) and line ministers were trained.
- IR Somalia completed the 1st cycle of unconditional cash transfer to 645 rights holders in the IDP camps of Bardhere, Gedo region of Jubaland.
- IR Somalia distributed food packs to 350 floods and conflict affected rights holders in Afgoye district, Lower Shabelle region South west state of Somalia. The food packs contained 25kg of rice, 25kg of white flour, 25kg of white sugar and 5 liters of cooking oil.
- IR Somalia provided unconditional cash transfer of 1st round to 1,840 Elnino affected rights holders in Beledweyne, Hiran region while each household received 70 dollars.

- IR Somalia distributed nutrition supplements to 1,000 malnourished living in the IDP camps of Daynile district.
- IR Somalia conducted mobilization, verification, and registration of 100 families for provision of reproductive and healthier goats in Burco district, Togdheer region of Somaliland.
- 700 conflicts affected households in Las'anod district received 2nd round of multipurpose cash transfers. Each household received 130 dollars.

WASH

- IR Somalia provided hygiene kits to 250 droughts affected families in the IDP camps of Berdale district of Bay region, South west state of Somalia.
- IR Somalia rehabilitated shallow two wells and constructed twenty communal latrines in the IDP camps of Berdale district of Bay region.
- A total 250 drought affected people living in the IDP camps of Berdale district received Non-food items from Islamic Relief.
- A total of 150 families, living in Sanag region of Somaliland, were registered for Non-Food Items by Islamic Relief. The non-food items consist of; mosquito nets, blankets, sleeping mats, plastic sheets, steel buckets, steel cups, and washable basins.
- IR provided NFIs to 500 Households living in Las'anod town of Sool region.
- IR Somalia conducted four hygiene promotion sessions in Tula-Samakab, Higlo, Las'anod and Herta Taleh districts in Sool region. A total of 5,289 males and 6,730 females attended the hygiene promotion sessions.

- IR Somalia rehabilitated three strategic boreholes in villages under Las'anod district of Sool region with installation of pump, pipelines extension. A total of 6,600 male and 8,400 female rights holders will benefit from the rehabilitated boreholes. Three water management committees were also trained on water for managing the rehabilitated boreholes.

HEALTH

- The three health centers of Islamic Relief in Shibis, Daynile and Balcad districts, provided free primary health care services to 1,539 male and 2,380 females.
- The health centers provided maternal health services -Antenatal care services reaching 987 mothers. Postnatal care and consultations were also given to 148 mothers.
- The health centers provided immunizations vaccines, targeting vaccine preventable diseases to the children under five (BCG, Polio, Penta, Measles,) for a total of 470 children (226 boys & 244 girls).
- The health centers provided 24 hours delivery service, in this reporting month, a total of 38 mothers gave birth and were attended by qualified midwifery nurses.

SAFEGUARDING & PROTECTION

- 50 participants from Beledweyne district received training on protection and GBV.
- IR Somalia's safeguarding and protection team, provided dignity kits to 300 secondary school going girls in Evergreen, Imam Nabawi, and Xanlay schools in Balcad district.
- Protection awareness sessions were conducted in Berdale district, South West State of Somalia. A total of 500 individuals living in the IDPs under Berdale District were reached with protection and GBV prevention messages.

- A total of 862 (girls 402) children have been reached through the child welfare and orphan support in Somaliland & Puntland.
- A total of 543 Annual progress Reports (PRs) were prepared from the target children and documented.
- 300 orphan reports uploaded to the Alyateem system
- Nineteen (19) orphan account books were recreated/re-established after being damaged or lost by their respective right holders.

Shelters in Baidoa’s Allaqadare camps provide safety for families and newborns

Hawa Ibrahim Kalbay, a 23-year-old mother of three children (two boys and one girl), resides with her 32-year-old husband, Ibrahim Isak Abdi, in the Allaqadare Internally Displaced People’s camps in Baidoa. Initially, Hawa and her family lived in a small plastic house that offered no protection from heat, cold, or rainwater leakage. This challenging living situation resulted in various health issues for the young children.

More than 4.3 million people – 1 in 4 – are now internally displaced within Somalia, the highest figure ever recorded in the country. In response to the growing needs of these IDPs, Islamic Relief launched, Integrated Humanitarian Response for IDPs and Host Communities in Baidoa, Berdale, and Dinsoor.

“Before we moved to this house, we lived in a small plastic house. It was a difficult situation. Sometimes, when I gave birth, my baby would suffer because the plastic house was too hot. We also experienced cold weather, and neither extreme temperatures nor rain prevented us. Even when it rained, the house leaked,” says Hawa.

In the Allaqadare camps in Baidoa, where Hawa lives, Islamic Relief constructed 20 shelters to provide protection from the sun, cold, and others to the most at-risk families in the in the camp. Halima Ibrahim was among the rights-holders of and shared how her life transformed after receiving this support.

During our interview, Hawa, who had recently given birth to a baby girl in the shelter constructed for her, expressed her deep gratitude and appreciation for Islamic Relief. She extended her thanks to the donors and Islamic Relief for providing her with this shelter.

“I gave birth to a baby girl in the shelter four days ago, and I am profoundly grateful to Islamic Relief and the donors who made this shelter possible. Their support has made a significant difference in my life,” says Hawa.

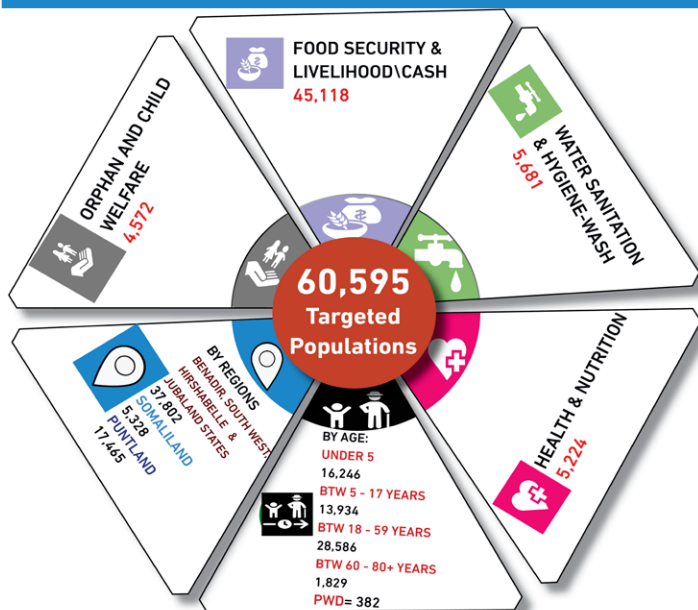

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- Ongoing conflict, limited funding, and logistical difficulties hindered humanitarian organizations' ability to reach and provide aid to vulnerable populations in month of February 2024.
- Access constraints, including insecurity and bureaucratic obstacles, continued to hamper the delivery of life-saving assistance which caused food insecurity and displacement.
- Heavy rainfall and flooding, compounded by previous droughts, pushed four million people (21% of the population) into high levels of food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above) between February and March 2024.
- 360 Cholera cases were reported in Somalia, prompting partners to scale up response activities.

IN SUMMARY



FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- 3,509 vulnerable Elnino flood affected families living in Balcad district, middle Shabelle region, received food packs of 72 kg of sorghum, 7.2 kg of split yellow peas and 3.96 kg of cooking oil. They mainly live in Horseed ,Garasbintow, Mareerey, Muryale, Isgoys and Hawo tako villages.
- 800 malnourished children of under five years, 200 women and 28 families of persons with disabilities living in the IDP camps of Daynile district received nutritional supplements. Each family received 2.5kg porridge, 5kg beans, 0.9kg milk powder and 1.5 liter of cooking oil.
- 1,589 malnourished children of under five years, 716 women and 35 families of persons with disabilities living in Afgoye district of lower Shabelle region received nutritional supplements of 2.5kg porridge, 5kg beans, 0.9kg milk powder and 1.5 liter of cooking oil.
- Islamic Relief handed over newly rehabilitated women's meat market in Borama Somaliland. The market can support 72 low-income women meat business.

- Islamic Relief distributed 1,400 reproductive and healthier goats to 100 households In Balli-Alanle and Ismail Hussein villages in Buroa district of Somaliland. Every household received fourteen goats.
- Islamic Relief registered 250 rights-holders to receive 80 dollars for 2 months in Qoryale village of Buroa district.
- Islamic Relief provided 4 blast freezers to the fishery community in Gumbah, Handa, Kulule and Celdhidir districts of Bari region, Puntland. Each freezer has a capacity of two (2) tons. The distributed blast freezers will support 1,500 families in the above locations.
- 600 households were registered for food packs distributions in Badhan district. Each family member will receive 25kg wheat flour, 25kg rice, 25kg sugar, 5kg dates, and 2.5 kg milk powder.

WASH

- Islamic Relief completed the rehabilitation and desilting of one earth dam in Baki district of Somaliland. The rehabilitated earth dam is 120x120 meters with 1-meter deep. The activity aimed at enhancing the dam's capacity, improving water quality, and ensuring the sustainable use of water resources for agricultural and community needs.
- Islamic Relief constructed Badhan district borehole infrastructure including 50 cubic meters elevated water tank, camel and goat troughs, one water kiosk, guard and generator room as well as solar system for the borehole. This made possible Water accessibility to 5,000 drought affected people

- The three health centers of Islamic Relief in Shibis, Daynile and Balcad districts, provided free primary health care services to 1,344 male and 2,347 females.
- The health centers provided maternal health services -Antenatal care services reaching 987 mothers. Postnatal care and consultations were also given to 148 mothers.
- The health centers provided Antenatal care services reaching about 805 mothers.
- Postnatal care and consultation services were also provided to 115 mothers.
- The health centers provided immunizations vaccines, targeting vaccine preventable diseases to the children under five (BCG, Polio, Penta, Measles,) for a total of 585 under five children (239 boys & 346 girls).
- The health centers provided 24 hours delivery service, in this reporting month, a total of 28 mothers gave birth and were attended by qualified midwifery nurses.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- 509 vulnerable families affected by the Elnino flooding, living in Rage Celle of middle Shabelle region, received food packages.
- 450 droughts affected households from the vulnerable families, living in Balcad district of middle Shabelle region, received nutrition supplements.
- 80 women VSLA groups, living in Balcad district of middle Shabelle region, received capital money for alternative income-generating activities to boost the livelihoods and the income of the business communities.
- 500 drought affected households in Deg-Galoole, Alla-Qadari, Kaysineey, Biilile, Bilan Abees, Buulo Gabley, 9 Mundul and El-Lahelow IDP camps in Baidoa district, received non-food items.
- Islamic Relief distributed food packs to 1,500 households in Jowhar middle Shabelle region. The families received: rice, wheat flour, sugar, and cooking oil.
- 1,241 households, in Garowe, Qardho, and Las'anod, received essential Ramadan food packages such as: sugar, wheat flour, rice, vegetable oil, and dates.

- Islamic Relief Somalia donated various equipment and furniture to Qardho Social Affairs Office in Karkar Region, Puntland, Somalia. The donation included laptops, printers, a projector, a hard disk, a desktop computer, desks, chairs, and cabinets. This aims to enhance the capacity of local authorities to serve Yemeni refugees in Qardho town.
- Islamic Relief Somalia registered and verified 200 drought-affected households in Burtinle, providing them with a one-time cash transfer. This initiative aims to support the food crisis and stabilize the affected people.
- 700 households from vulnerable people were provided to Ramadan food packages in Hargeisa, Somaliland.

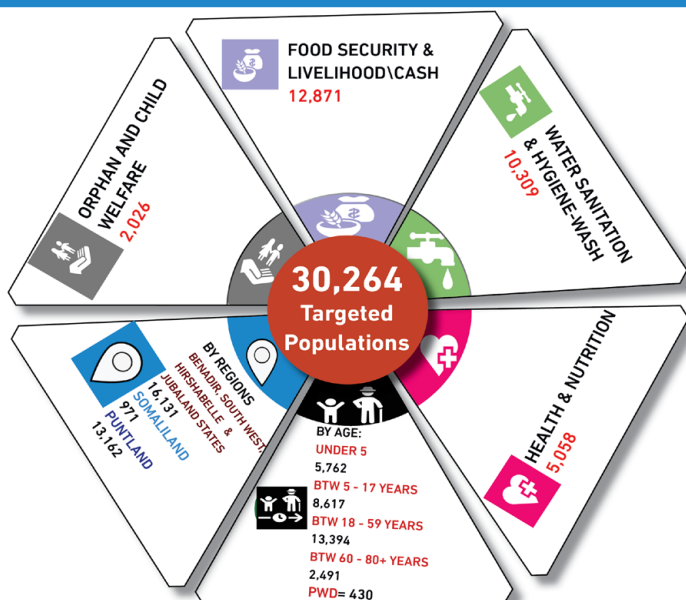

- March 17, 2024: 4 million people in Somalia, equivalent to 21% of the population, experiencing food insecurity.
- Cholera outbreak remains a significant concern in Somalia.
- A six-month plan to address the cholera outbreak has been devised, requiring \$5.6 million in funding.
- 1.7 million children in Somalia are at risk of acute malnutrition, including 430,000 severely malnourished.
- The 2024 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan for Somalia, aiming to assist 5.2 million vulnerable individuals, has only received 8.2% of the necessary funding.
- Cholera cases in Somalia have surpassed the emergency threshold, necessitating urgent intervention.
- Ongoing conflict in Somalia continues to drive displacement.
- Recent clashes in the Beledweyne district have resulted in the displacement of over 600 people and civilian casualties.
- Weather forecast predicts moderate to heavy rainfall in regions including Somaliland, Jubaland, South West, Hirshabelle, and Galgaduud from March 27 to April 2, 2024.

WASH

- 1,050 households from the vulnerable people in the camps of Balcad district, middle Shabelle region, received hygiene kits.
- Islamic Relief constructed Badhan 1 borehole infrastructure to improve water accessibility and provide clean water to communities. The project supported 1,697 males and 3,303 females of the exposed families.
- Islamic Relief provided dignity kits to 100 vulnerable women living in the IDP camps of Bardhere district, Gedo region, Somalia.

HEALTH

- IR Somalia health centers provided primary healthcare services, including consultations for non-communicable diseases, maternal health services, and 24-hour facility deliveries. Beneficiaries included 3,482 individuals in Banadir (Daynile & Shibus) and Balcad of Middle Shabelle region.
- IR Somalia distributed nutrition supplements to 700 children under 5 years old and 350 pregnant/lactating women in Daynile district.

The WARES project improves the safety of young women who walk vast distances to get water.

In response to diseases in the camps of Baidoa, South West State of Somalia, such as water-borne diseases, unsanitary and filthy conditions, and general water shortages, Islamic Relief launched the Water Intervention and Recovery for Somalia (WARES project), a five-month project funded by Islamic Relief Malaysia.

The project has already improved the lives of 3,000 rights holders in the Nasiib Wanaag 2 and Balanbale IDP camps in Baidoa by restoring and building water facilities in the camps. They now have access to clean and safe water just next door.

The project guaranteed that drought-affected communities had access to clean, safe, and potable water by constructing elevated water tanks, repairing shallow wells, providing a solarized system, and extending pipe connections to take water from the shallow well to community locations.

The project also installed two water kiosks, each with six taps, to provide simple access to water in the area. So far, the program has achieved its goal of providing clean and safe water to communities in two IDP camps in Baidoa, as well as housing people affected by Somalia's droughts.

Among the rights-holders we supported through this project was Sangaba. She is a widowed mother of three children who lives in Balanbale IDP camp in Baidoa.

Sangaba displaced from Weelbarow village, in the south of Baidoa city about 125kms, because of the droughts and the conflicts in the country. She is now living in one of the largest IDP camps in Baidoa.

She mentioned that she displaced from her village because of the droughts and the conflicts in the country. She had goats but all went with the droughts.

“Really, we felt the support of this project as we did not have enough water and used to collect it from far distances. Now, it is our next door and you can imagine how happy we are today” “This support has really increased the safety of the young ladies that used to travel distances for fetching water. Now, they are 100% safe and collect water next door” says a mother of three children who was among the rights-holders of this project, Sangaba Aliyow Nurow.

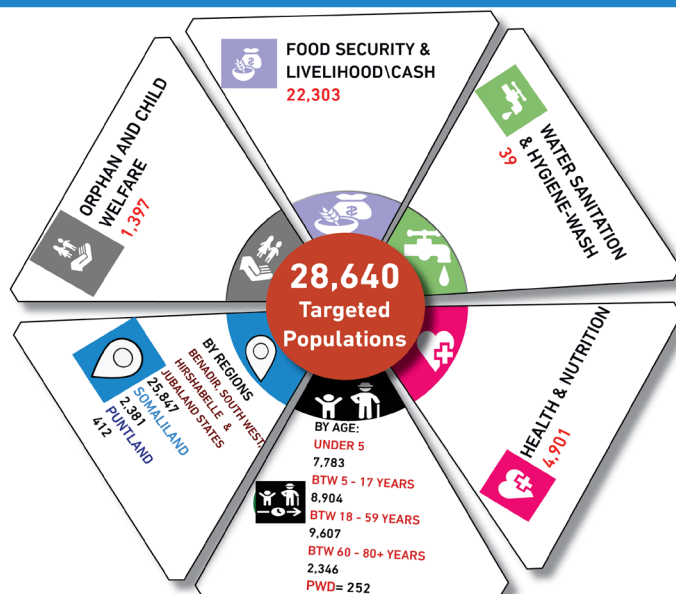

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- More than 127,000 people have been affected by the Gu (April to June) rains, with 5,100 people displaced and seven children killed since April 19th. The worst-impacted states are Jubaland, Hirshabelle, and the South West.
- On April 27th, flash floods inundated roads connecting the Dhobley and Afmadow districts in Jubaland State, temporarily rendering them impassable. This has affected approximately 60,000 people in the two districts.
- The current floods in Somalia have caused damage to 77 farmlands, resulting in the displacement of 8,376 people.
- Additionally, 3,000 people have been relocated, and there have been seven reported deaths. A total of seven districts have been affected, with 1,023 houses destroyed and one school damaged. Moreover, 4,445 latrines have been destroyed, and approximately 100 livestock have been killed. These impacts have been experienced across Somalia.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- Islamic Relief provided Eidul Fitr gifts to 150 children in Qardho, including Yemeni refugees and the impoverished host communities.
- The IRS successfully installed four greenhouses with a capacity of 8 x 24 m in Dhanaha and Ceelbuh villages. Additionally, they conducted a two-day capacity-building training on greenhouse and drip irrigation management for 40 members of agricultural cooperatives.
- Islamic Relief Somalia distributed food packs and nutrition support to 2,060 vulnerable households in Balcad. The distribution included rice (25kg), wheat flour (25 kg), and cooking oil (5 liters).
- Islamic Relief Somalia provided supplements to 450 vulnerable households in the Balcad district of the Middle Shabell region.
- Eidul Fitr Gifts were distributed to 933 individuals (466 boys and 467 girls) in Gargar 1 and 2, Alle Amin, Halgan, and Daryel in the Middle Shabelle Region-Balcad.
- Islamic Relief provided Eidul Fitr gifts to 1,000 vulnerable children from poor families in Baidoa IDPs and host communities.

- Islamic Relief Somalia provided unconditional cash transfers to 1,000 vulnerable households in the Baidoa district of the Bay region.
- Islamic Relief provided food packages of sorghum (72kg), pulses (7.2kg), and cooking oil (3.96 liters) in Adale district, Middle Shabelle, benefiting 405 households.
- Islamic Relief provided training on business skills to 160 households in Bardhere, Gedo region.
- Food packs including rice (25kg), wheat flour (25kg), and cooking oil (5 liters) were distributed to 1,000 households in Jowhar IDPs and villages including Bananey, Kongo, Kalundi, Bulo-bishar, and Hantiwadag.
- Cash transfers were provided to 1,000 households in Bulo-Xaji Jinka, Gumarey, and Guumeysin in the Jowhar district of the Middle Shabelle region.
- Islamic Relief conducted community mobilization activities, including sensation, verification, and registration, for 100 households in Qoyta and Beer villages in the Togdheer region of Somaliland.
- Islamic Relief released the third phase of unconditional cash transfers for 200 households in Erigavo, Somaliland.

- 650 women in Hawotako, Hanlay, Horseed, and Basro IDPs in Balcad district received dignity kits.

HEALTH

- Islamic Relief Somalia provided consultations for non-communicable diseases such as pneumonia, malaria, diarrhea, skin conditions, injury care, urinary tract infections, and sexually transmitted infections to women, men, boys, and girls. A total of 3,337 individuals received these services in Horseed, 77, Sakhawadiin, Banadir (Daynile and Shibis), and Balcad (Middle Shabelle). Antenatal care services were offered at the health facilities in Horseed, 77, Sakhawadiin, Banadir (Daynile and Shibis), and Balcad (Middle Shabelle). A total of 936 individuals received these services.
- Islamic Relief Somalia supported immunization efforts targeting vaccine-preventable diseases for children under five, including BCG, polio, penta, measles, and others. A total of 552 children in Horseed, 77 in Sakhawadiin, Banadir (Daynile and Shibis), and Balcad (Middle Shabelle) received these vaccinations.
- Islamic Relief Somalia conducted 24-hour deliveries at Sakhawadin villages in Daynile and Shibis and Balcad, Middle Shabelle, with the assistance of skilled birth attendants. A total of 42 deliveries were done.

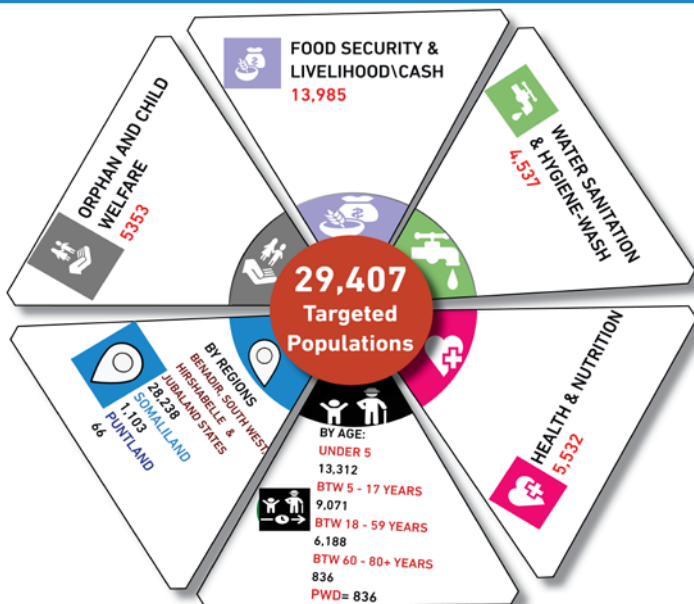

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- The Gu' rains have significantly impacted at least 203,438 individuals, with 37,120 displaced and 9 casualties. Infrastructure and livestock have also been damaged.
- The states of Hirshabelle, Jubaland, and South West are particularly hard-hit by the effects of the rains.
- On May 6, Dolow experienced a record-breaking rainfall of 117mm, the highest daily amount since 2016.
- The 2024 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan, which requires USD 1.6 billion, is currently only 11 percent funded, requiring urgent additional funding.
- 4 million people are facing crisis/food insecurity, and 1.7 million children are facing acute malnutrition.
- Protection concerns have arisen due to displacements and heavy rains, with reports of impacts on protection cases. 3.2 million people (17% of the population) are in IPC Phase 3 (Crisis), and around 800,000 people (4% of the population) are in IPC Phase 4 (Emergency).

- Islamic Relief provided non-food items to 450 households in the internally displaced peoples camps of Dinsor district, Bay region, Somalia.
- 501 households, living in the villages of Adale and Raagacele, received Relief In-Kind Food from Islamic Relief. This was to provide nutritious and wholesome meals to individuals and families.
- 500 households living in the villages of Bula-waas in Jowhar, Somalia, received the first cycle of food.
- Islamic Relief provided food items to 200 households living in the IDP camps of Bardhere, Gedo region, Somalia.
- Islamic Relief provided VSLA kits to eight groups, each consisting of 20 members, empowering a total of 160 individuals in Gedo-Bardhere, Somalia.

- Post-Distribution Monitoring survey was conducted for 92 unconditional cash transfer programme households in Erigavo District, Sanaag Region, Somaliland.
- A BREAC Project Launch Workshop was conducted to engage key stakeholders, including government officials, community leaders, and beneficiary representatives, in Somaliland.

WASH

- 28 community members of the water management committees in Wardheer, Badhan, Elbuh, and Rad districts of Puntland, Somalia, received water management training.
- Emergency shelter kits were distributed to 400 houses affected by floods in IDP camps in Beledweyne district, Hiran Region, Somalia.
- Women's Dignity Kits were distributed to 700 households affected by recent floods in IDP camps in Beledweyne district, Somalia.
- In the Baki District of the Awdal region of Somaliland, thirteen members of the Water Management Committee received training.

- The three health centers conducted 24-hour health facility deliveries with the assistance of skilled birth attendants, and 38 women were supported through this service during May.

- Islamic Relief protection and safeguarding team trained 50 households on GBV/SGBV prevention and safeguarding in Dinsoor Bay, region, Somalia.
- Islamic Relief protection, safeguarding and GBV case workers managed to identify 10 cases who were supported with Psychosocial support and counselling in our health facilities in Daynile and Balcad.

ORPHAN & CHILD WELFARE

- 263 APRs were collected from Somaliland and Puntland in May 2024.
- 820 APRs were uploaded to the system in Puntland, in May 2024.
- The Dr. Hany Orphans Support Fund in Somaliland and Puntland has supported 6 cases of health and shelter through its assistance.

Maryan Hussein from Las'anod town of Sool region

Islamic Relief's timely response saves lives for many displaced people fleeing conflict in Las'anod

Maryan Hussein Ahmed, a 48-year-old mother of seven, resides in Erigavo city, which is part of the Sanaag region. She fled the fighting in Las'anod in search of refuge for her and her family, and she has been in Erigavo for 8 months now.

Maryan had to leave her city because of the violence and bullet impact caused by the ongoing war. They had to walk more than 200 km to reach Erigavo in search of protection and security, putting them vulnerable to starvation and thirst.

"We used to reside in Las'anod, but when the war broke out, we escaped and went vast distances to keep ourselves safe," Maryan said of their escape from their home and arrival in Erigavo. We finally arrived in Erigavo after spending numerous nights sleeping under trees and very hungry."

Due to food and water shortages, Maryan's family has faced existential threats and constant concerns about how they would be able to support themselves. They suffered from social, emotional, and psychological problems that rendered them vulnerable to dangers to their lives and made them desperately need humanitarian aid.

Maryan reflects about their difficult experiences, saying, "We find comfort in the knowledge that Allah is always there for us, even though living as a displaced person or refugee is incredibly difficult. Though it comes with its own set of difficulties, another door opens as one closes.

In response to the threats and difficulties in life that Maryan and numerous households fleeing the Las'anod conflict faced, Islamic Relief launched **the Support for Las'anod Displaced People (SOLD Project)**, made possible by a donation from Islamic Relief Canada. This project aims to provide emergency humanitarian aid, such as unconditional cash transfers, non-food items, and hygiene kits, to the most vulnerable individuals who have been displaced.

"Islamic Relief has opened up an enormous opportunity for us," Maryan says thanking the organization for its support and financial assistance. Prior to this endeavor, we had numerous difficulties, particularly with regard to food and water. I express my gratitude to Islamic Relief and all of its donors.

"For providing us with three months of cash support; we appreciate Islamic Relief's prompt and kind assistance. I pray that Allah would bless you for helping," says Maryan.

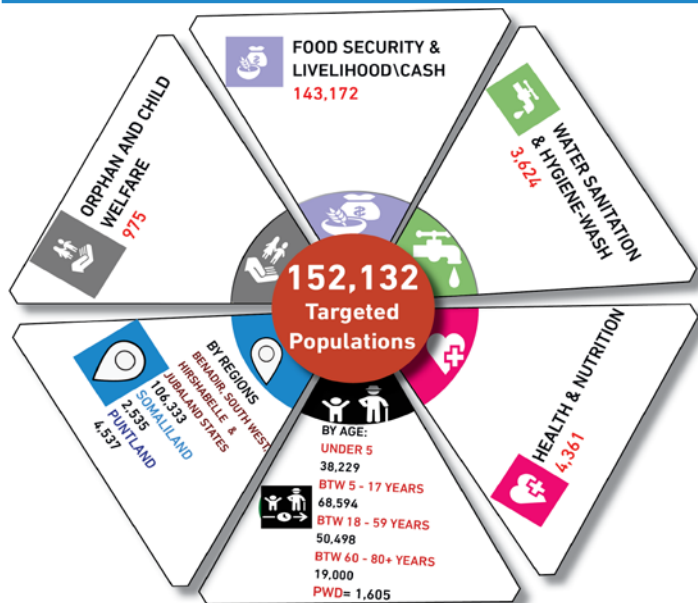

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- Over 3.8 million people are currently displaced in Somalia, facing numerous challenges.
- The 2024 Somalia Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan requires USD 1.6 billion, but only 24 percent of the funding has been secured as of June 23.
- Although the number of people in need has decreased from 8.3 million in 2023 to 6.9 million in 2024, the situation remains challenging.
- Inflation has significantly impacted certain areas, particularly in the lower south-central regions, such as Jubaland and Somaliland, leading to soaring prices of essential goods and services.
- Donor shrinking is a significant issue, with donors primarily focusing on other regions such as Sudan, Palestine, and Ukraine. However, Somalia faces recurring floods, droughts, water shortages in certain areas, and ongoing conflicts, all of which have a severe negative impact on the country.

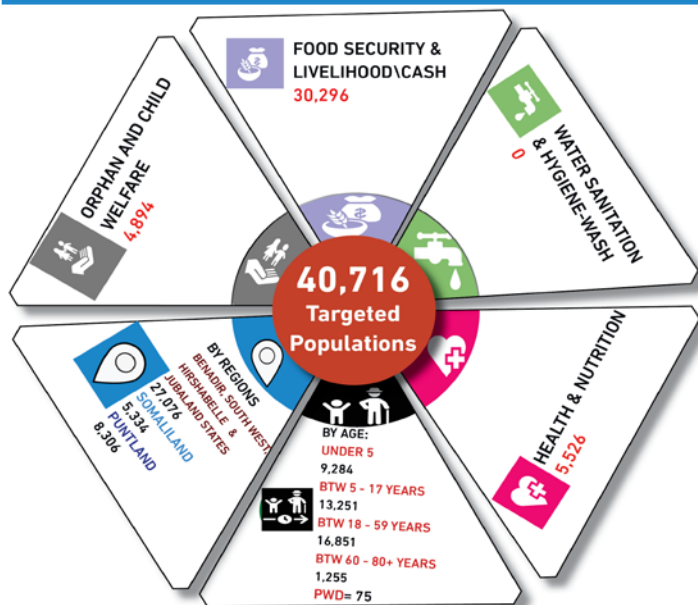

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- One in five Somalis faces acute food insecurity, with an IPC analysis estimating that at least 3.4 million people face it (about 15% of the population).
- Improvement is expected in rural areas where enhanced pasture and water for livestock and increased agricultural activities in crop-dependent areas are foreseen.
- Since the beginning of 2024, 14,389 new cholera cases with 122 deaths (0.8% case fatality rate) have been recorded, including 2,421 cases and 16 deaths.
- In Kismayo, Lower Juba region, around 1,620 individuals (270 households) of newly displaced people from Buulo Xaaji and surrounding villages have arrived as of July 30, 2024.
- Approximately 8.25 million people, or 50 percent of Somalia's population, need humanitarian and protection assistance, with over 3.2 million people displaced due to conflict. Economic instability, including high unemployment and a substantial current account deficit, is also a significant challenge.

Shukri Muse ,45, from Jilib 2 IDP Camp, Garowe, Somalia



“ This meat pack has provided us with the essential nutrients we were missing ”

The Aqqa project provides meat packages to more than 3,000 low-income families in Puntland.

Shukri Muse, 45, is the mother of six children: three girls and three boys. Her husband, Isse Ahmed, works at the quarry and sells stones to home builders in order to support his family.

The family is currently living in the Jilib Two IDP Camp in Puntland's Garowe neighborhood, where they shelter many vulnerable people. Shukri and her family come across daily challenges, including having no way to buy regular meat, which makes it impossible for them to eat three meals per day.

Islamic Relief Somalia's Puntland office carried out the Aqqa program in Garowe, Qardho, Burtinle, and Godobjiran.

The project was to help the most vulnerable communities, such as orphaned children, female-headed households, those with disabilities (PWD), and internally displaced people (IDPs), by providing fresh meat.

“We are a big family living in an IDP camp. My husband, Ahmed, is the sole breadwinner for the entire family. He does not have a stable job and works in a quarry, which is difficult, especially as he gets older. Sometimes he comes home exhausted with no money for meals, and other times he utilizes what little he earns to sustain our family,” Shukri explains.

“We don't even think about meat because we don't get basic foods. If we have lunch, we can't have dinner, and if we have dinner, we can't have breakfast. We are a family struggling with the essentials of life,” says Shukri.

“The IR meat pack has helped my family significantly. We haven't had meat for a long time, but today, Alhamdulillah, we received some meat, and I am very happy. I am grateful to Islamic Relief and the Muslims who donated. May Allah reward them. This meat pack provided us with essential nutrients we were missing, improved our overall health, and brought us joy during this tough time,” says Shukri.

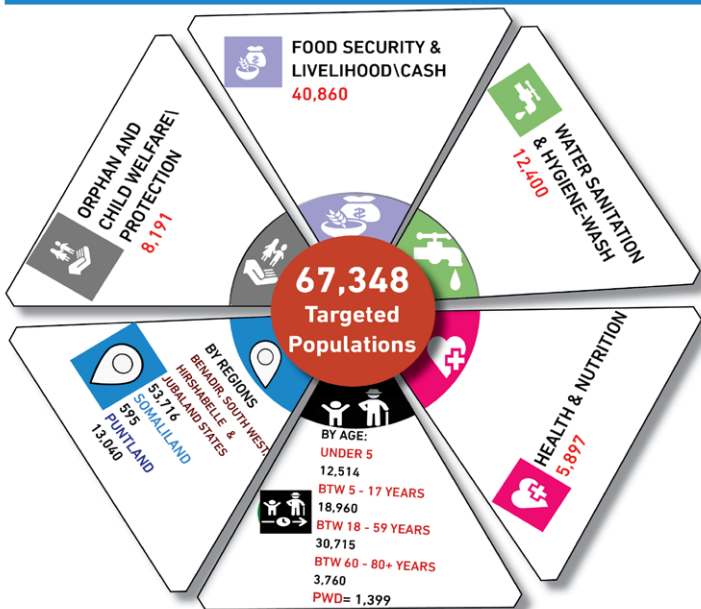

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- It estimates that 6.9 million individuals require humanitarian and protection assistance in Somalia.
- Financial Required in 2024 is US\$1.6 billion to address the humanitarian needs in Somalia.

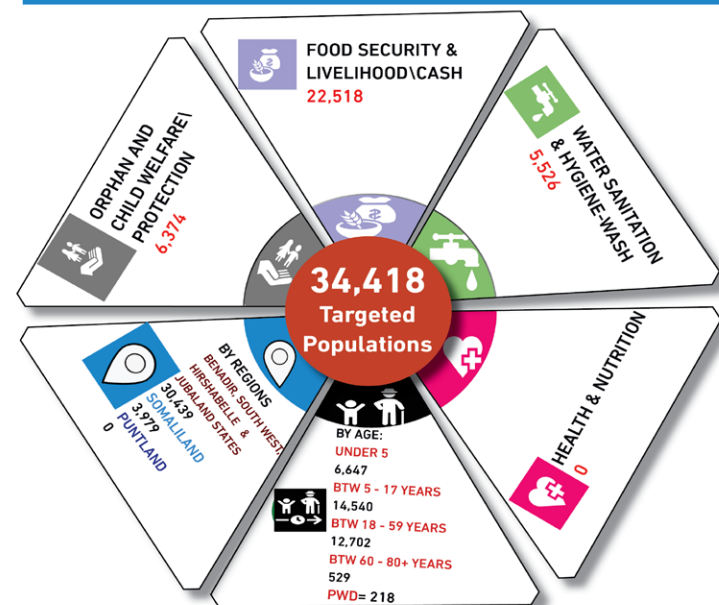

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- \$1.6 billion is required in 2024 to assist 5.2 million people, a 37% decrease from the previous year's \$2.6 billion for 7.6 million people.
- Recurrent challenges such as droughts, floods, conflict, insecurity, disease outbreaks, and poverty continue to worsen humanitarian needs.
- Approximately 4 million people face food insecurity, with 1.7 million children experiencing acute malnutrition in 2024.
- Erratic rainfall affected crop production in agropastoral livelihoods, while floods in certain regions displaced populations and disrupted agricultural activities and market access.
- Around 3.6 million Somalis (19% of the population) are in IPC AFI Phase 3 or above, with 2.9 million in IPC AFI Phase 3 (Crisis) and approximately 724,000 in IPC AFI Phase 4 (Emergency) conditions between July to September 2024.

Three months of monetary assistance restores hope for many low-income families in Somalia's Jowhar district.

Dero Ahmed Abdulle, 55, lives in Alla-Amin Internally Displaced People's camps, Jowhar, in the north of Mogadishu, the capital city of Somalia, with her seven (7) orphan children. Jowhar district is about 90 kilometers in the north of Mogadishu.

She was born and raised in Baladul-Amin district of Middle Shabelle region, which is about 50 km to Jowhar district of Middle Shabelle region, Somalia. She displaced here, Jowhar, due to frequent droughts and floods that devastated her farm and left with her livestock. In her first arrival in Jowhar, she got a settlement in Bada-Cas IDP camp, where she spent four (4) years and later was displaced to Alla-Amin IDP because of the flooding that hugely affected her camp after her displacement. She is now living in Alla-Amin IDP for about four months.

Her husband, Abdirizak Mohamed, died three years ago, and she now cares for their seven (7) orphaned children. She always goes to nearby fields to collect green grass, which she then sells at the market to families with animals. She occasionally receives money, which she uses to support the entire family, but it is insufficient to cover school fees and the daily food. She used to go on every day to the farms to produce crops for household consumption during her village but most of her farmlands and crops were destroyed due to the severe floods of river Shabelle.

The IRFAH project provided cash grants of \$80 to 1,100 families for about 3 months as well as provision emergency hygiene kits & non-food items. Dero Ahmed Abdulle, a 55-year-old widowed mother of seven orphan children, was among those who benefited from the three-month cash payments. Dero was overjoyed to get the financial grant after losing both crops and her farm due to river Shabelle flooding.

"We were quite desperate, and Islamic Relief's assistance came just in time during the flooding. We will never forget your generosity," says Dero, a mother of seven orphans living in the Alla-Amin IDP camp in Jowhar, Somalia.

"Your gift of cash has improved the lives of money moms who have orphaned children like me." "It was extremely helpful, and we were overjoyed across the past three months because we received cash money with which to purchase food. So we had something to rely on. "Thanks to both Islamic Relief and the contributor," says Dero Ahmed.

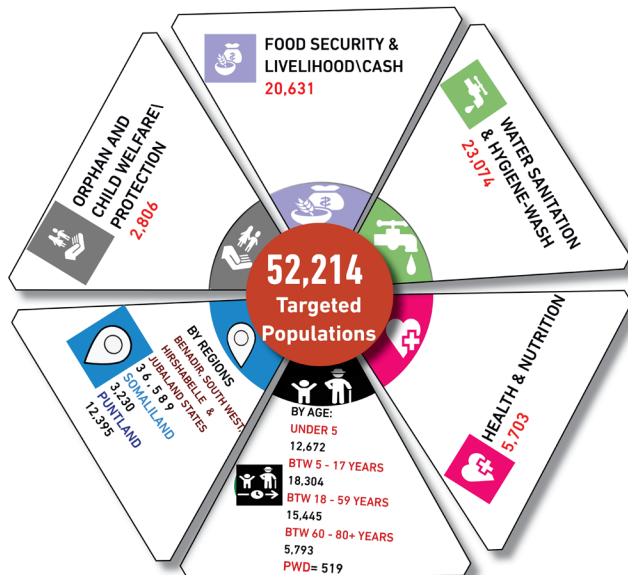

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- Currently, 3.6 million people are experiencing crisis levels of hunger, a figure projected to rise to 4.4 million between October and December due to various factors such as below-average rains, localized flooding, conflict, high food prices, and diseases contributing to acute food insecurity and malnutrition.
- The latest IPC analysis indicates an 80 percent chance of La Niña conditions, which may lead to drought in Somalia, with forecasts suggesting a below-normal Dayr rainy season and above-normal temperatures, resulting in severe soil moisture loss and further deterioration of food security in vulnerable communities.
- The situation is critical for children, with 1.6 million under five at risk of acute malnutrition, including 403,000 expected to suffer from severe malnutrition.
- An estimated 4 million people face crisis or emergency food insecurity, and 1.7 million children face acute malnutrition, including 430,000 who are likely to be severely malnourished in 2024.
- Compared to the same season last year, this represents a 14% increase in Global Acute Malnutrition and a 21% increase in Severe Acute Malnutrition.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- Islamic Relief collaborated with the Ministry of Livestock and Rural Development in Gabiley to train Community Animal Health Workers (CAHWs) in Somaliland's Arabsiyo district where ten people received the training.
- 150 women milk sellers received hygiene practices and cheese-making techniques. This was about three groups of 50 members each, while they were also trained on good handling of milk, storage, and transportation. These women are in Borama district of the Awdal region, Somaliland.
- In Somaliland villages of Baki and Ruqi, a group of 105 members from five group Savings and Loan Associations got small-scale business training in management and entrepreneurship.
- The fourth cycle of unconditional cash transfers was distributed to 650 households in the Bardhere district of Gedo, Somalia.
- In-kind food kits were distributed to 859 families in Balcad neighborhood in Somalia's Middle Shabelle region.
- 50 women of milk cooperatives in Garowe, Puntland, Somalia, received hygiene and quality assurance training.

- In-kind food kits were distributed to 680 families in Adale neighborhood in Somalia's Middle Shabelle region.
- In-kind food kits were distributed to 667 families in Ragecelle neighborhood in Somalia's Middle Shabelle region.
- Islamic Relief distributed food vouchers to 255 families in Warsheikh district of Middle Shabelle region, Somalia.
- 100 farmers living in Garowe district of Nugal region, Somalia, received agricultural seeds and tools.
- 58 members of VSLA groups from the Yemen refugee communities in Qardho, Puntland, Somalia, received training.

HEALTH

- 3,950 women, men, boys, and girls received primary healthcare services and consultation for non-communicable diseases like pneumonia, malaria, diarrhea, skin conditions, injury care, urinary tract infections, and sexually transmitted infections from Islamic Relief health centers in Shibis, Daynile, and Balcad.
- 967 women got antenatal treatment in the three facilities of Shibis, Daynile in the Banadir region, and Balcad in Middle Shabelle, Somalia.
- 182 females received postnatal care at the health facilities in Daynile, Shibis, and Balcad districts.
- The three health centers conducted 24-hour health facility deliveries with the assistance of skilled birth attendants, and 44 women were supported through this service during October.

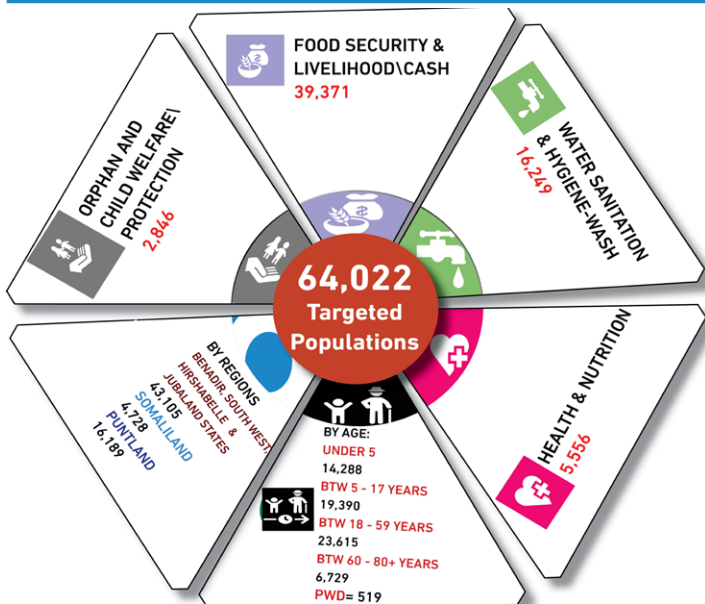

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- 5.98 million people are expected to require humanitarian assistance in 2025.
- 4.6 million individuals are slated to receive aid in 2025.
- \$234.8 million in cash and voucher assistance was distributed from January to September 2024.
- Only 44% of the funding required for the 2024 response plan has been secured.
- Riverine floods in Beledweyne have displaced 14,300 people.
- There has been a notable increase in the use of cash-based transfers to support emergency response and specific sectoral interventions. This strategy aims to empower affected communities and promote local economies.
- Ten districts have been identified for integrated, inter-cluster response in the 2025 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan: Daynille, Kahda, Afmadow, Diinsoor, Jowhar, Baidoa, Jamame, Beledweyne, Bu'aale, and Qansah-Dhere.

FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD

- A total of 901 families in Somalia's Middle Shabelle region received much-needed food assistance. Each household was provided with a generous kit containing 72 kilograms of sorghum, 7.2 kilograms of split yellow peas, and 7.92 liters of cooking oil. This essential aid was distributed across three districts: Balcad (437 families), Adale (304 families), and Ragacele (160 families).
- 2,378 households received Aqiiqah meat packs from Islamic Relief in Jowhar District, Somalia.
- 1,000 households received unconditional cash grants from Islamic Relief in Baidoa District, Bay Region, Somalia.
- 10 participants received plant protection training, both theoretical and practical, facilitated by the Somaliland Ministry of Agriculture and Development, with the support of Islamic Relief.

- 150 households in Bodhlay and Beenyo-Qalocan villages, Arabsiyo district, Somaliland, received solar-powered torches to aid lactating mothers during their visits to Maternal and Child Health (MCH) centers.
- 150 women milk sellers in Dila and Kalabaydh, Borama District, Somaliland, received training on milk hygiene and cheese-making practices.

WASH

- Islamic Relief Somalia conducted sanitation and hygiene awareness sessions for 150 households in Bardhere district's IDP camps.
- 25 farmers in Darasalam district, Marodijeh region, Somaliland, received water pump machines and HDPE pipes to improve irrigation.
- 600 households in the Qardho district of Puntland, Somalia, received essential hygiene and Non-Food Item (NFI) kits from Islamic Relief Somalia to improve sanitation conditions.
- Islamic Relief Somalia rehabilitated the Jalam/Bandar Salam borehole in Puntland, Somalia, to improve water accessibility for the vulnerable community residing in the village.
- Islamic Relief Somalia conducted a training program for 14 water management committee members in Puntland, Somalia, focusing on the operation and maintenance of water facilities.
- Islamic Relief Somalia initiated a hygiene awareness campaign in Bandar Salam, Jalam, and Xarxar villages, Puntland, to enhance community hygiene and sanitation practices.

HEALTH

- 3,465 individuals (women, men, boys, and girls) received essential healthcare services, including treatment for non-communicable diseases like pneumonia, malaria, diarrhea, skin conditions, injuries, urinary tract infections, and sexually transmitted infections. These services were provided by Islamic Relief health centers in Shibis, Daynile, and Balcad.
- 928 women received prenatal care at the three health facilities in Shibis, Daynile (Banadir region), and Balcad (Middle Shabelle).
- 184 women received postnatal care at the health facilities in Daynile, Shibis, and Balcad.
- 52 women received 24-hour health facility deliveries with the assistance of skilled birth attendants at the three health centers.
- The three health centers, Shibis, Daynile, and Balcad, conducted immunization outreach programs, benefiting around 422 families with children under five years old.

SAFEGUARDING & PROTECTION

- Islamic Relief Somalia's safeguarding and protection division provided counseling and support to individuals affected by protection and safeguarding issues in Balcad, Daynile, Shibus districts of Mogadishu, and the Middle Shabelle region.
- The protection sector offered psychosocial support and counseling services in safe women's spaces in Daynile and Balcad.
- Islamic Relief Somalia conducted community awareness sessions on SGBV prevention in Balcad and Daynile, reaching 140 households (840 individuals), including 504 females and 336 males.

ORPHAN & CHILD WELFARE

- Islamic Relief Somalia verified 240 new orphan families in Somaliland's Hargeisa district.
- Islamic Relief Somalia updated 1,578 payment record books at Self Help Group (SHG) sessions in Somaliland.

In the current reporting month, the team successfully gathered 118 feedback submissions, marking a significant increase of over 75% compared to previous months. This substantial rise underscores the team's success in actively engaging with current rightsholders across all intervention areas.

The team's dedication to utilizing various feedback channels has also been instrumental in this achievement. The CRM register for the month indicates that nearly all feedback channels were actively employed to capture a wide range of feedback from rightsholders. This milestone further solidifies the MEAL team's commitment to effective feedback mechanisms and continuous improvement.

SOLAR POWER BOOSTS SOMALI FARMER'S DREAMS

Hodan Abdirizak, a resilient Somali farmer, is a shining example of how technology can revolutionize agriculture, even in the most challenging of circumstances. With the support of the SARIA Project, Hodan has not only increased her farm's productivity but also improved her family's quality of life.

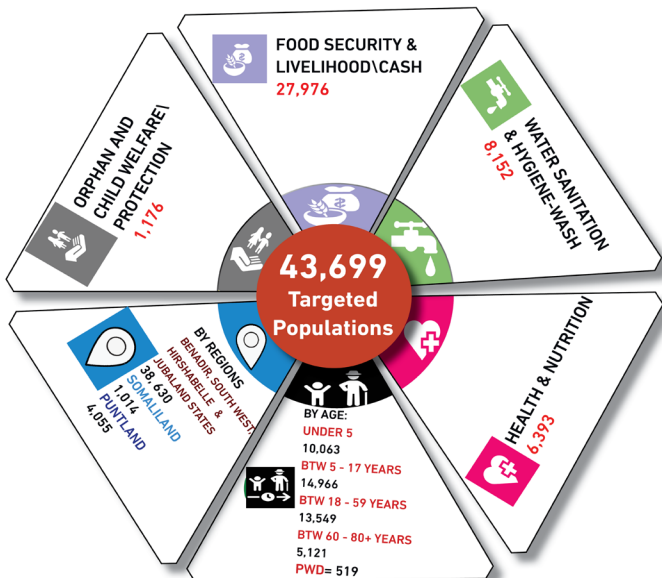

Humanitarian Highlight In Somalia

- A total of \$1.59 Billion was required for humanitarian assistance.
- As of now, \$689.9 Million has been received, representing only 43.5% of the total fund required for humanitarian assistance.
- Around 3.6 million people are currently facing a crisis and worse food security issues.
- Nearly 2.9 million people are currently facing crisis conditions or are classified in Phase 3 of the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification
- 724,000 people, representing 4% of the population, are experiencing Emergency levels of food insecurity.
- A further deterioration of the food security situation is anticipated due to below-normal Deyr season rains.
- The number of people facing Crisis or worse levels of food insecurity is expected to rise to 4.4 million, accounting for 23% of the population, by 2025.

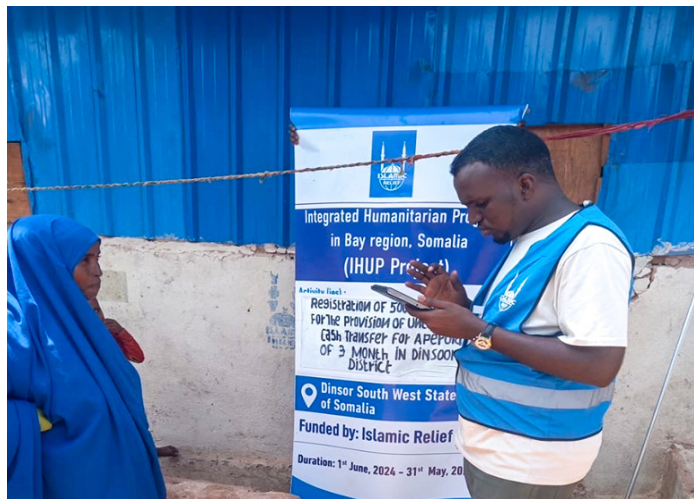

HEALTH

- A total of 4,392 consultations were conducted in Daynile & Shibis of Banadir region and Balcad district.
- Islamic Relief provided maternal health services and Antenatal care services at health facilities for 1,072 individuals in Daynile & Shibis of Banadir region and Balcad district.

SAFEGUARDING & PROTECTION

- Islamic Relief protection team visited target locations such as Daynile, Shibis, and Balcad, providing counselling and support to those who have experienced various forms of abuse, helping them navigate their experiences and connect to available services, especially in our health facilities.
- Islamic Relief protection and safeguarding team conducted awareness campaigns emphasizing that violence against women and girls is never acceptable. We advocate for zero tolerance across society and aim to prevent violence by discouraging harmful social norms.
- The campaign also encourages the community to participate in initiatives that advocate for stronger laws, better enforcement, and more resources to end violence against women and girls.
- Islamic Relief conducted a campaign to encourage the community to speak out and use their voices to challenge harmful norms and support survivors in the Balcad district.
- Islamic Relief protection, Inclusion, and safeguarding team conducted community awareness sessions for sexual gender-based violence and gender-based violence prevention, reaching 150 households in Daynile, Shibis, and Balcad districts.
- Islamic Relief protection team provide counselling support services in Daynile and Shibis health facilities, reaching 10 individuals who experienced disturbing issues, primarily related to domestic violence.
